What is Narcan (also known as naloxone)?

 FDA-approved nasal spray medication that reverses the effects of an opioid overdose by blocking receptors in the brain and restoring breathing.

When should you use Narcan/naloxone?

• If you suspect a person is overdosing on opioids. Signs of overdose include unresponsiveness, slow or shallow breathing, pinpoint (really small) pupils, blue fingernails or lips, vomiting, or gurgling noises.

Who should carry Narcan/naloxone?

Anyone who may be able to help someone who needs it! Family and friends
of people who have opioid use disorder. Individuals taking opioids, whether
prescribed or not, especially in high doses. Individuals who have abused
opioids in the past.

Is Narcan/naloxone dangerous?

- No, you cannot overdose on narcan/naloxone
- No, you cannot be addicted to narcan/naloxone
- You can give narcan/naloxone to anyone, including children and pregnant women.
